- Out with the old in with the new. The old 2,500-gallon Pressure Tank was removed yesterday by Clark Constructors and the new 5,000-gallon pressure tank was delivered today by Bulldog Steel and off loaded by Clark Constructors.
- Our new piping in the plant to be completed in the next few weeks is going to be performed by Lester Construction.
- Our Maintenance is replacing some of the old piping in the pump house currently.
- Next Steps: You will start seeing lots of boring under Carancahua Blvd. and new piping installed to the distribution lines. We are putting in 2 lines vs. just having 1 existing line. This will help us better serve our community.
- The cost of this project from assessment monies is estimated at \$261,000, which was taken out as a lease loan through Co-Bank. Once this work is all complete the water plant will be in maintenance mode. We will plan to start systematically replacing main lines around the Cape as we can afford to. We also plan to start looking at digital meters for the future.

We are building a Grow Free Sharing Station for the community. This concept will be “give what you can and take what you need. It will be located on the horseshoe driveway at the water department. George Bell has offered to build it for free and Carlos Garcia, C&G Construction and Remodeling has agreed to donate the lumber. Thank you to both of you.
