- If you have driven down Carancahua Boulevard you have experienced the road construction and road closures. So here is what is happening. The plant's piping was extremely old and needed to be replaced. The construction crews shut down Carancahua Boulevard to bore under the road and to lay new main line piping. This created a new loop to serve our customers better. After the completion of this project 98% of the piping will have been replaced in the plant, as well as master meter and valves. The construction crew has disinfected the new piping and we will be disinfecting the new tank next week. Bacteriological samples were taken on the new piping and will also be done on the new tank. We will obtain approval from TCEQ before it is put into service. This project will be completed within two more weeks.
- The cost of this project from assessment monies is estimated at \$261,000, which was taken out as a lease loan through Co-Bank. Once this work is all complete the water plant will be in maintenance mode. We will plan to start systematically replacing main lines around the Cape as we can afford to. We also plan to start looking at digital meters for the future.
- Mercer Controls is upgrading and bury electrical wiring and AEP is upgrading our power grid in the plant.
- After the new year we will be scheduling a community meeting on a Conservation effort with a Rain Barrel Program, so be looking for communication on this if you are interested.
